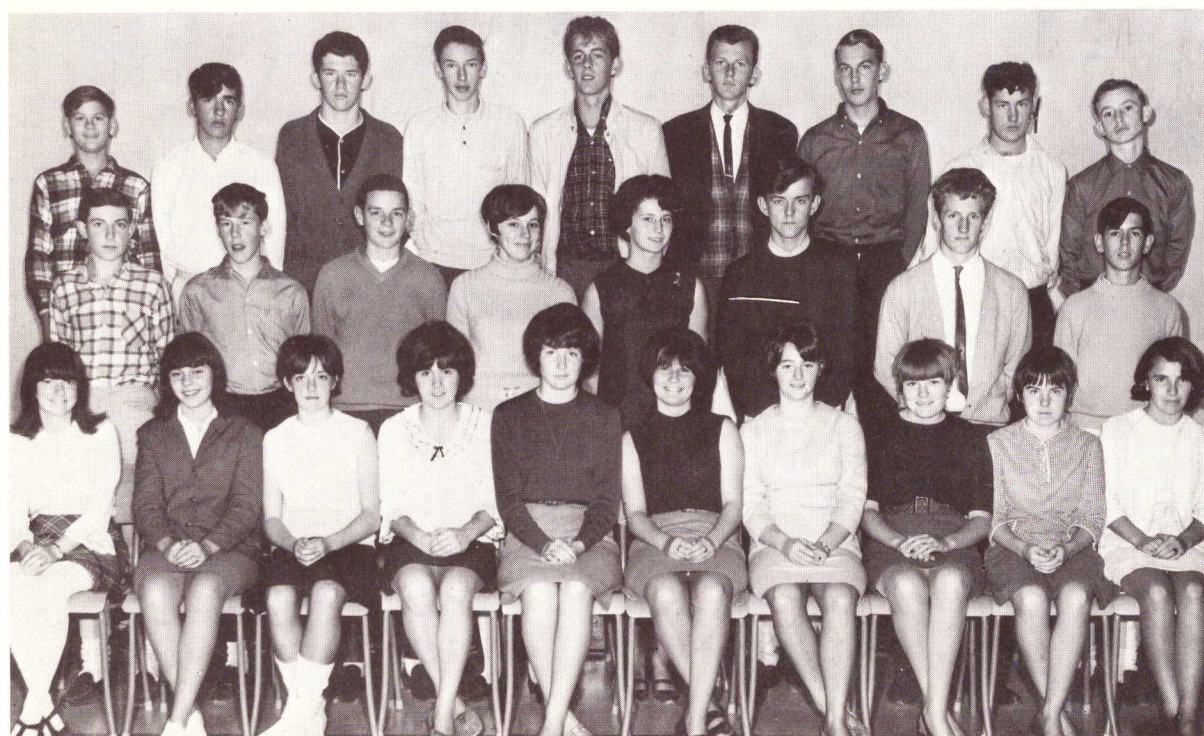

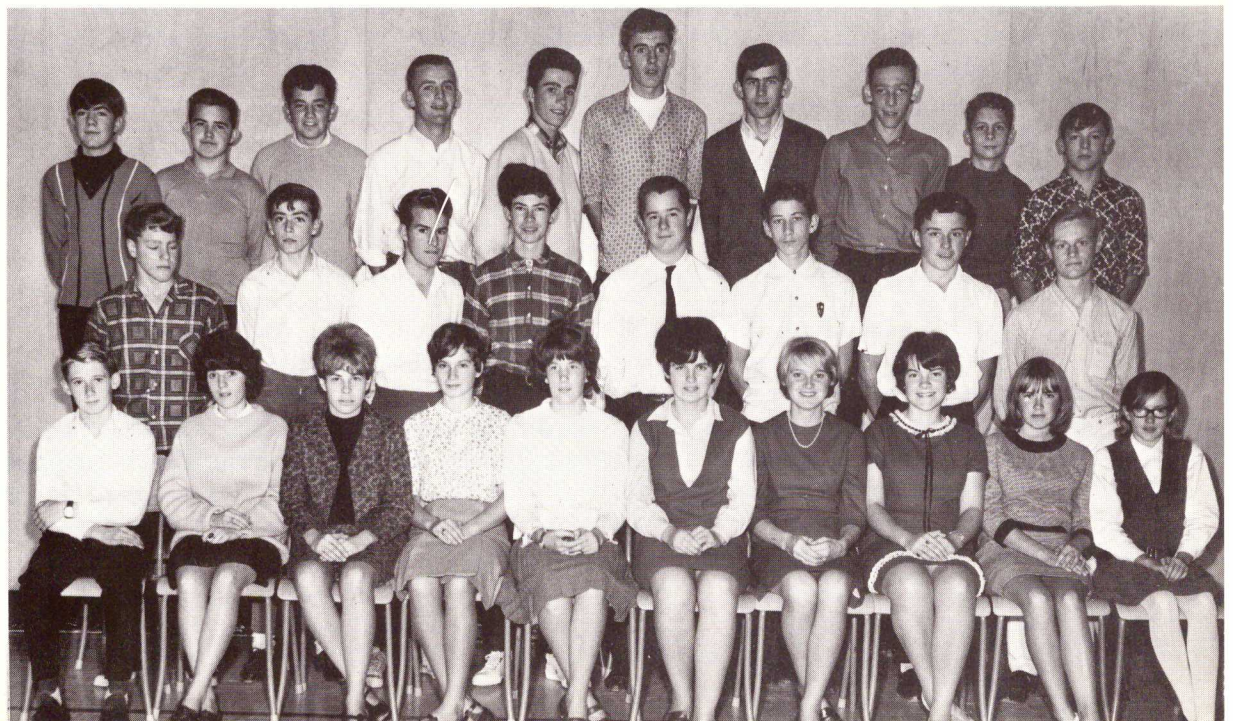

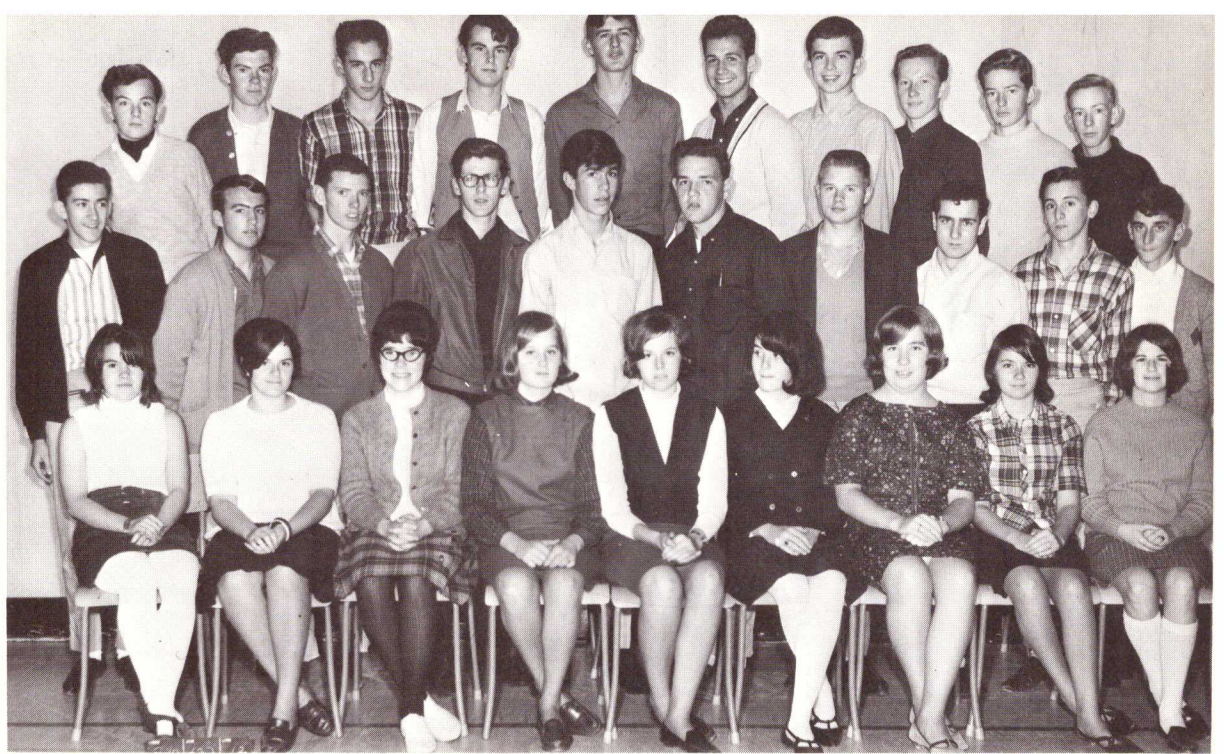
10C

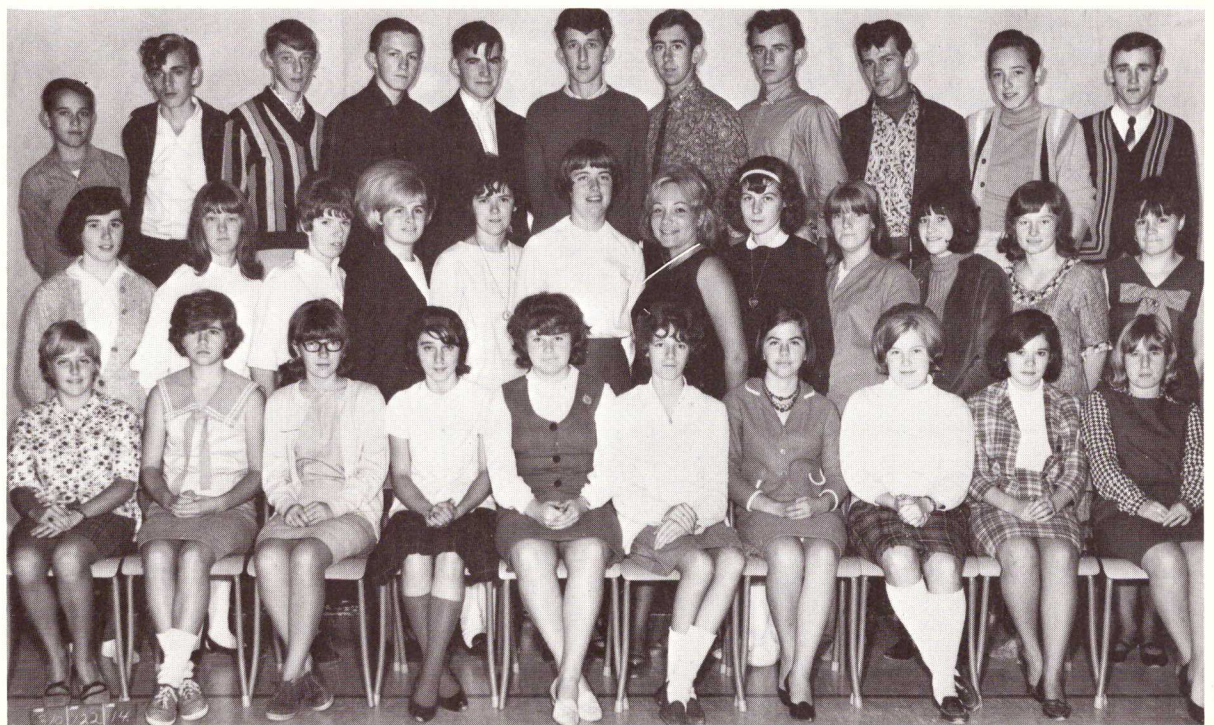

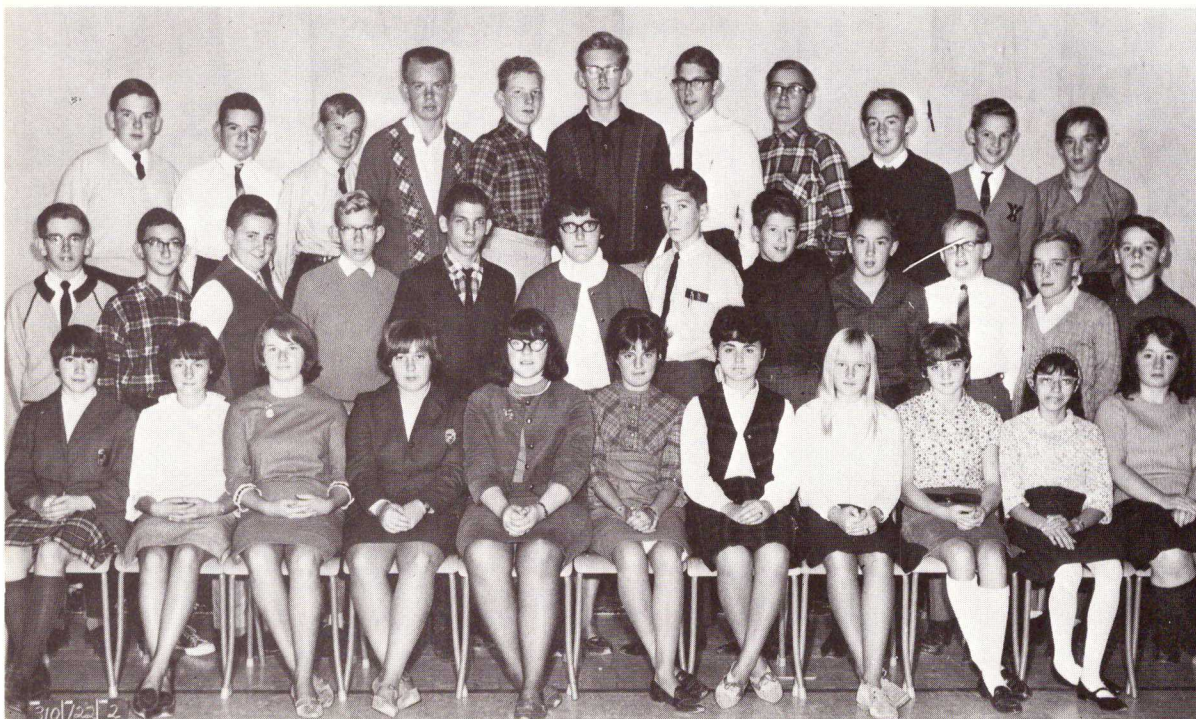

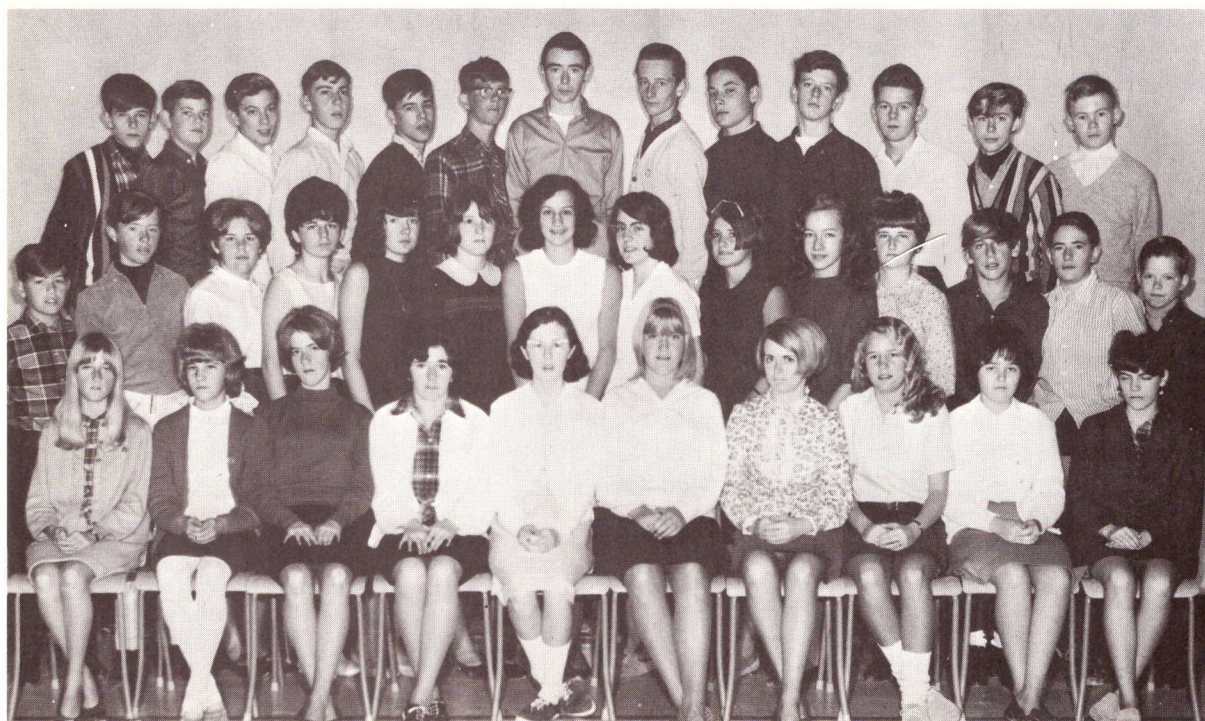
9A

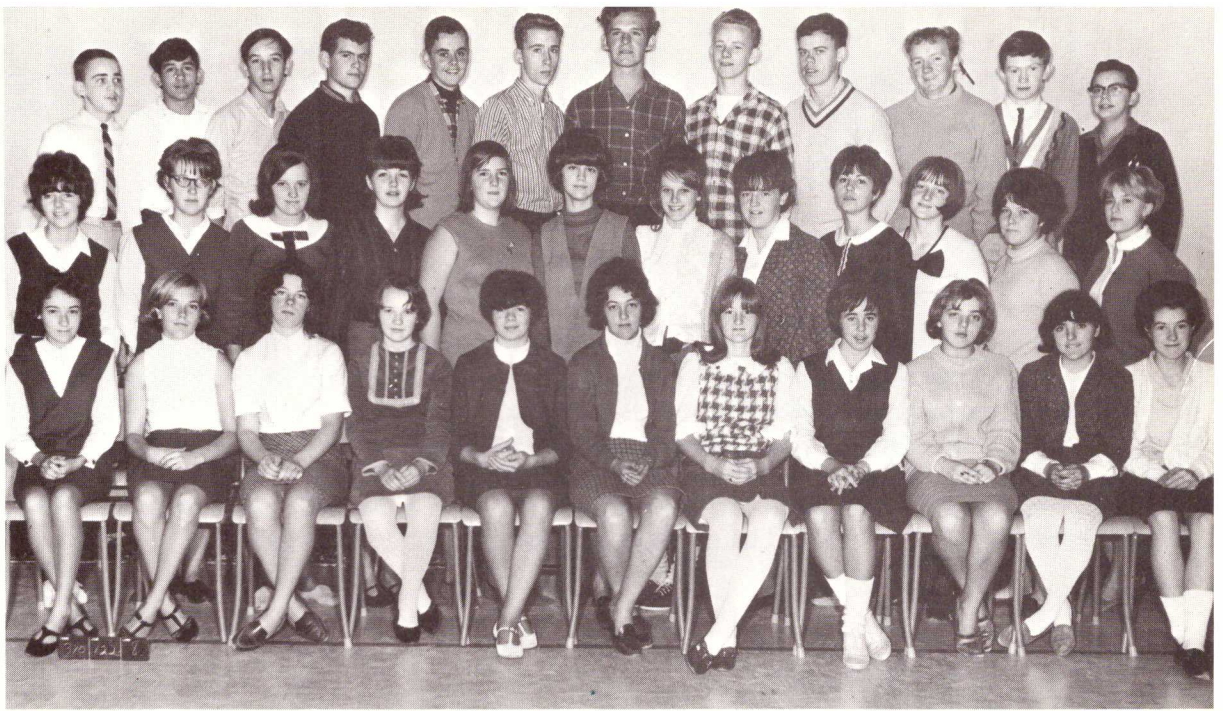

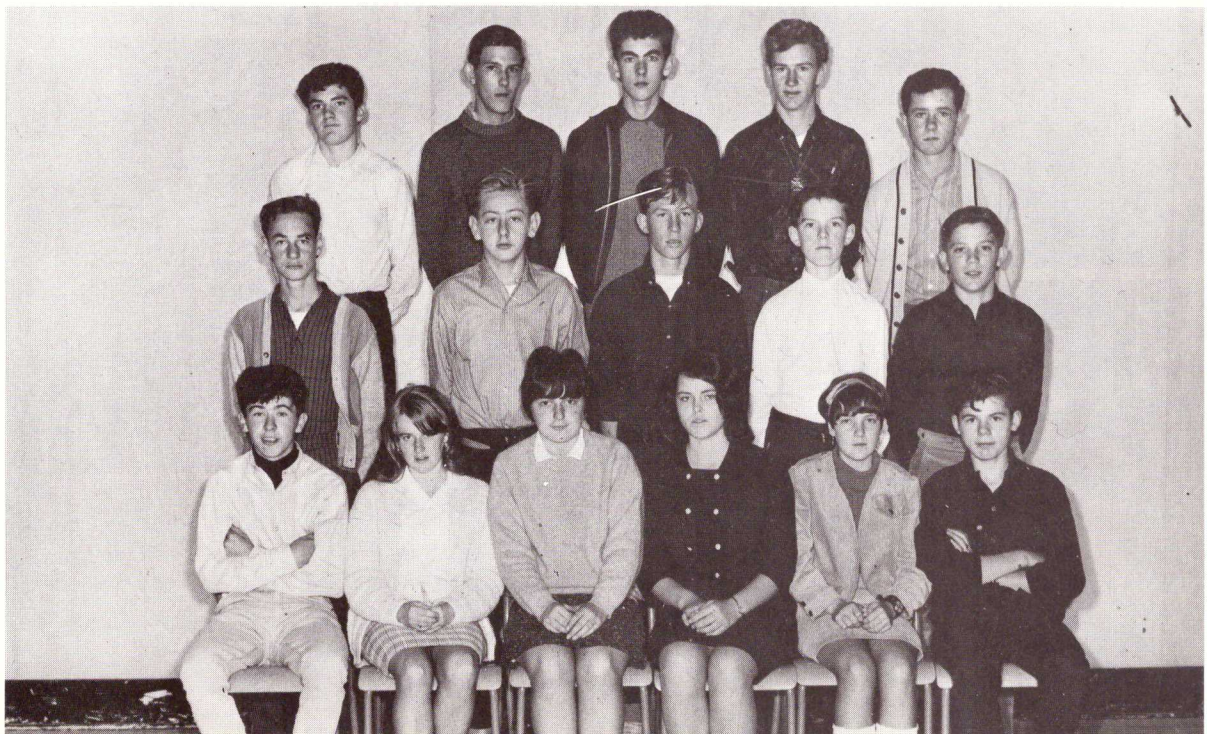
