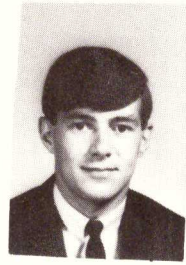

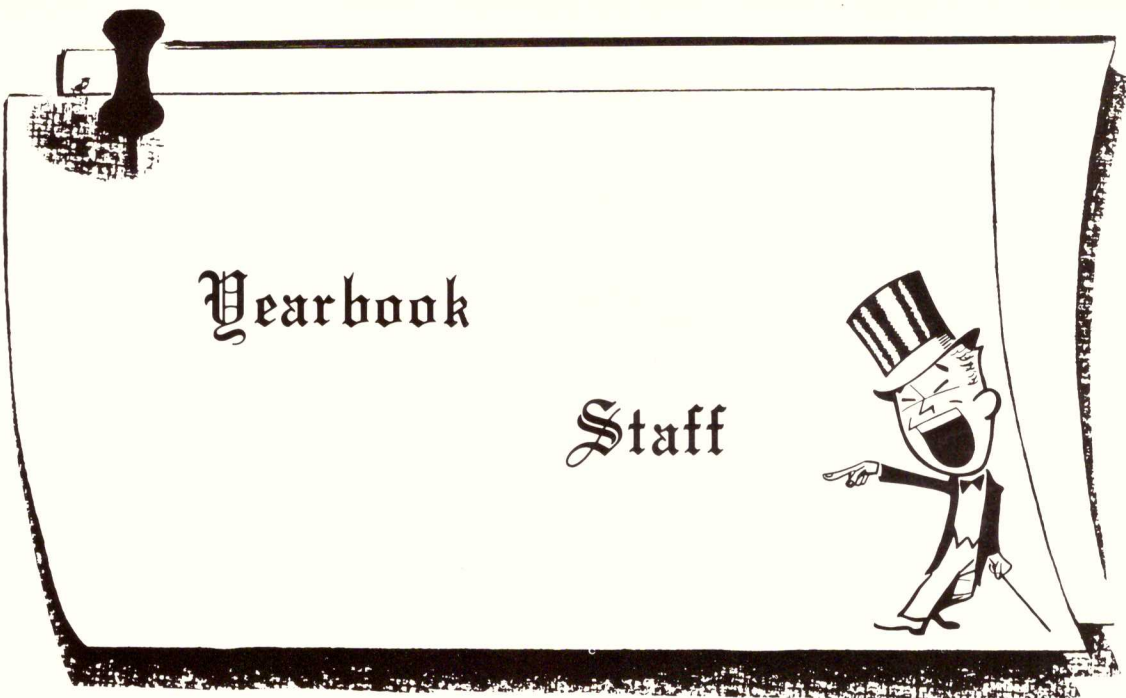

It was said by all to have been great -- the best ever.



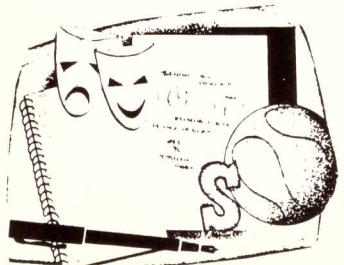
