Class Report - B2

Apart from Ray's falling asleep in class at least once a week, class activities did not start until our Junior Red Cross held a drive to raise money for the Greek Chest. Except for donations, the money was raised by means of a slave trade and a fudge sale.

As the slave trade started, the girls were auctioned off. Since there are more girls than boys in our class, some boys had more than one slave. As their slaves we were forced to obey all their orders or we had to pay a nickle to the bottle which contained the donations for the Greek Chest.

The girls had to carry books and sneakers, shine shoes, wash boards, and even feed their masters. But two days later the tide was turned when the boys were auctioned off. Because of the shortage of boys, many girls owned "shares" in the slaves, owning maybe one third of one and one half of another. In order to pay back our slaves we forced them to carry out humiliating orders. One boy, for example, had to walk around the school during break, with a doll under his arm, yelling "I believe in Santa Claus".

Our efforts in this campaign brought us \$32.10 and placed us second in the contest.

The girls of our class who take Home Economics held a buffet supper for the teachers. All members of the staff were invited and the event, which was looked forward to with anticipation by those who took part, was truly a success and the girls received many compliments for their fine showing.

Debates were also held by the Economic students of our class. The first topic being "The Advantages of Buying over Renting", the second, "Should Canada Have Nuclear Arms?" Those taking part were Robert Power and Stephen Anderson against John Miles and myself. Robert and Stephen being the winners both times, a challenge was put forth by Ron Whitehead and myself on the topic "Are the Atlantic Development Board, A.P.E.C., and Industrial Estates the answer to the economic ailments of Nova Scotia?"

Class effort then went into the girl's interclass volleyball games with our team being the final winners. Those participating on our class team were Nancy Wooden, Muriel Just, Cathy Pelham, Charlotte Baldwin, Linda Armsworthy, and myself, Diane Howell.
