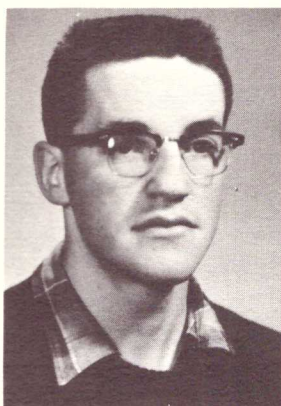
Principal's Message

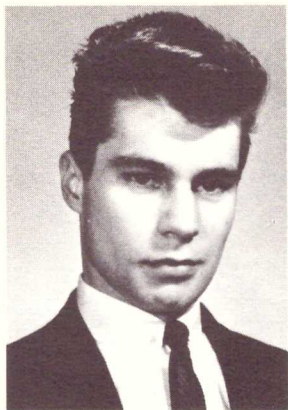

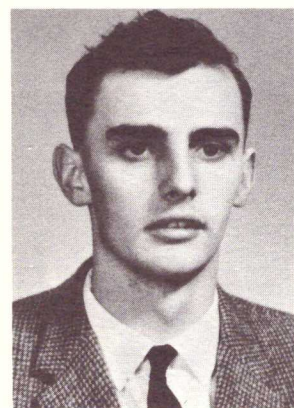
