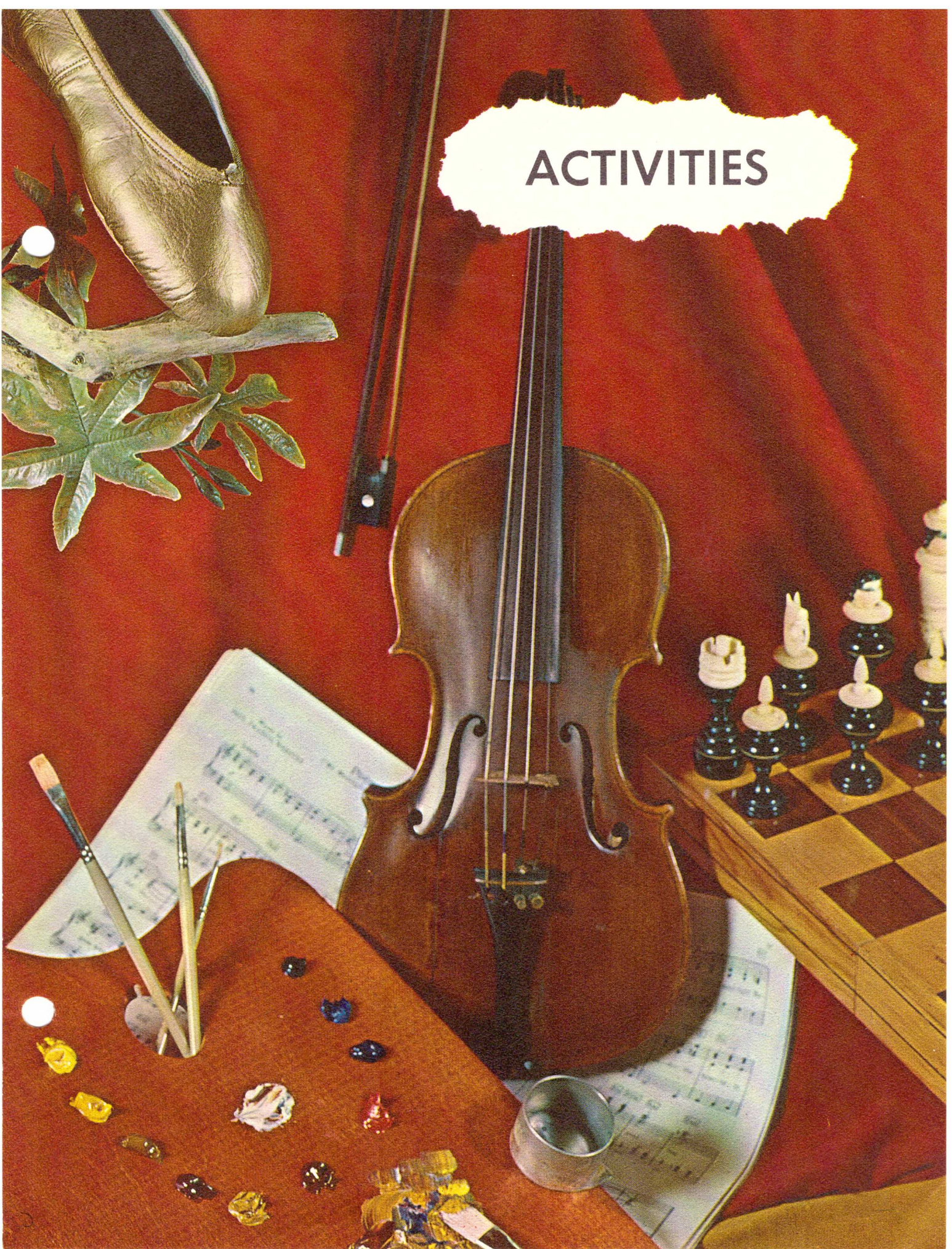
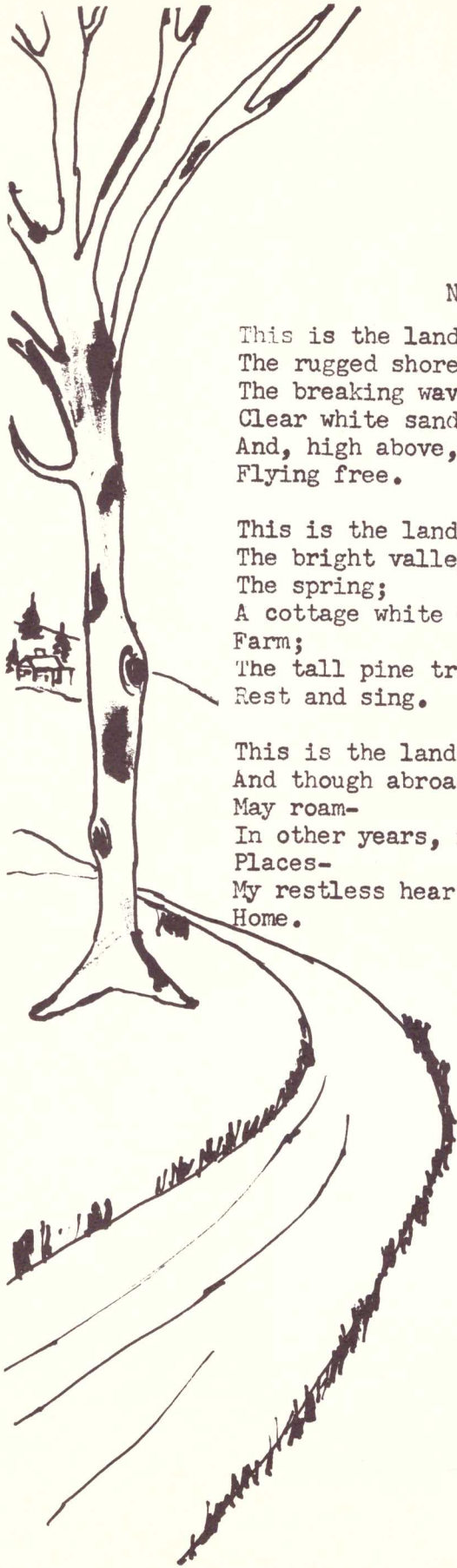

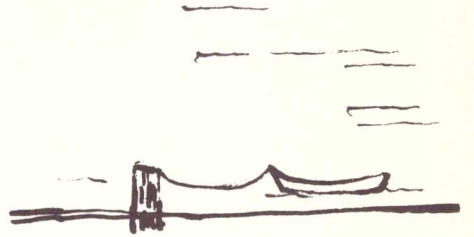
Nova Scotia

RED CROSS REPORT

The year '63/64 started out slowly for the Red Cross, but gradually built up, coming to a peak during the week of January 25-29, 1964 when we held our Milk Bottle Drive. A total of \$220.60 was raised during the Drive, with the winning class, 9N, having \$31.00 at the end of the week. The prize was a five pound box of chocolates donated by the local I.G.A. With this money we plan to buy two Easter dinners, give a \$50.00 scholarship, and set aside \$50.00 for a delegate. The chief project this year was "Cents for the Centenary Fund" in aid of the Freedom from Hunger Campaign.

Red Cross crests and pins were made available to the students and approximately sixty-seven crests and fifty-eight pins were sold.

The Red-Cross held a boys-girls basketball game, which brought in \$11.50. A student-teacher basketball game was postponed until the spring.

Camp Hill Hospital held a drive for 1,000 pencils to be used by the veterans in their activities. A drive was held, and the students, along with Mr. Williams' Economics class donated 178 pencils. These were presented to Mrs. Baker, Director of the Nova Scotia Division of the Red Cross, when she visited the school during February.

Our Red Cross Advisors this year were Miss Henderson and Mr Williams. our success throughout the year was due to their help, but it was also the result of the co-operation of the entire student body.
