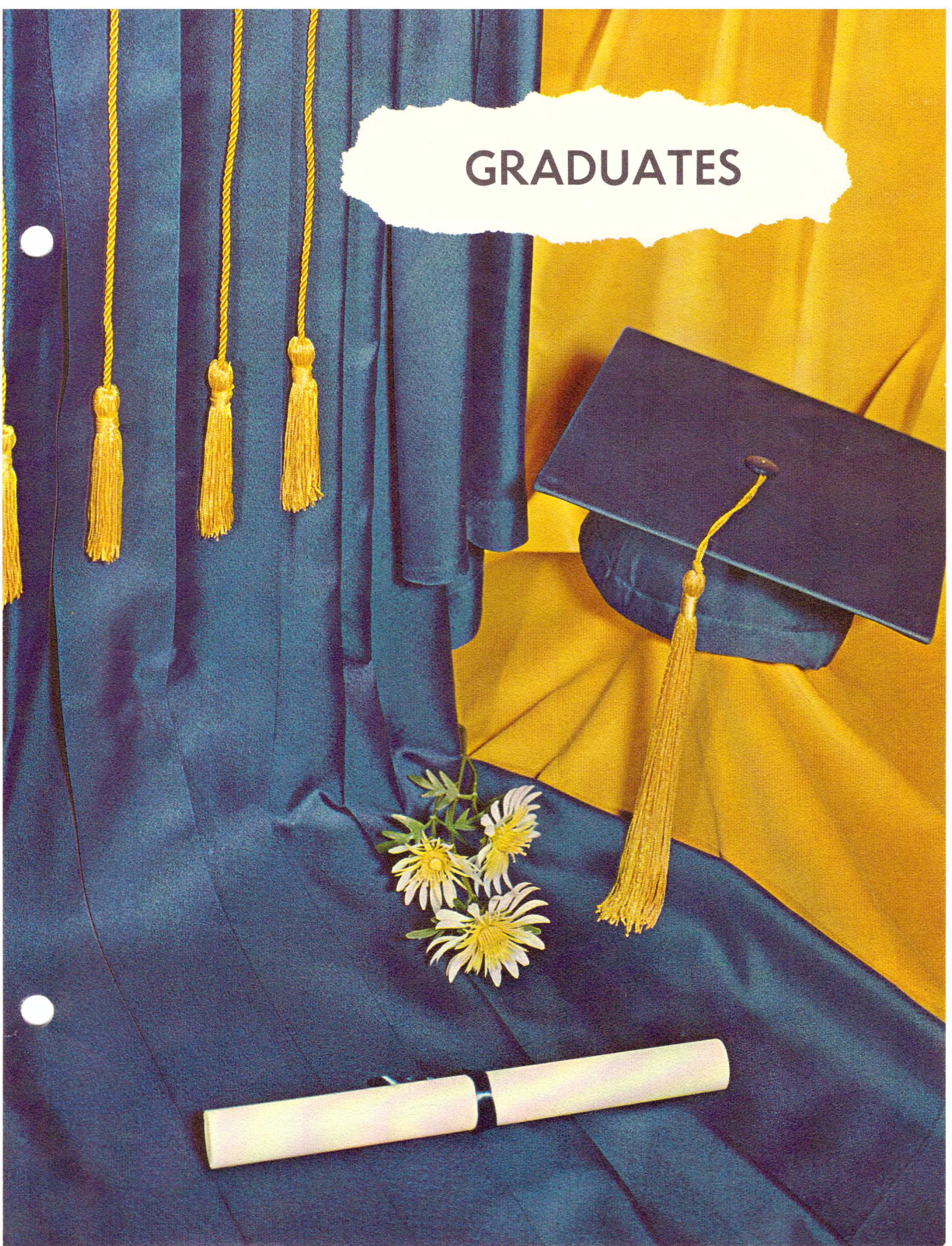

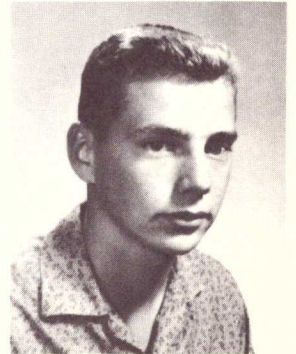
LEADING THE SCHOOL IS 12-A

Outside of school, we're not so sure."

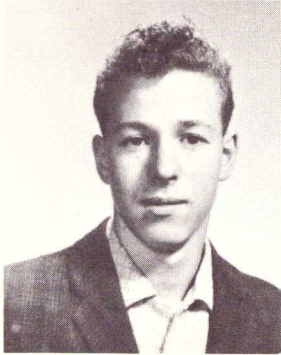

Well liked by everyone."

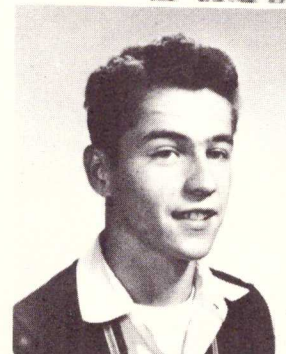

Than tall and cast a shadow."

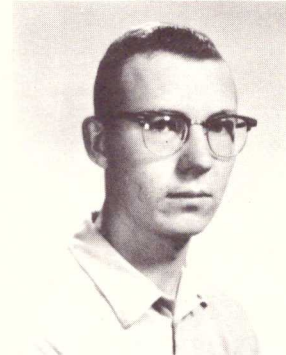

"If there's a will, there's a way."

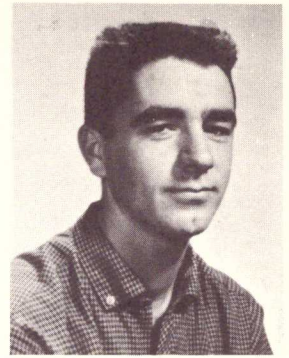

I'd rather sleep."

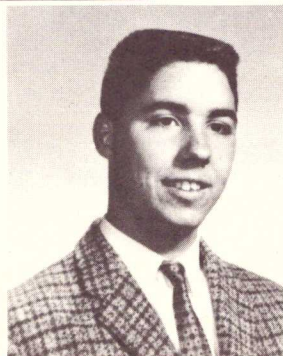

" Speaking of countdowns, its time to catch that rocket."

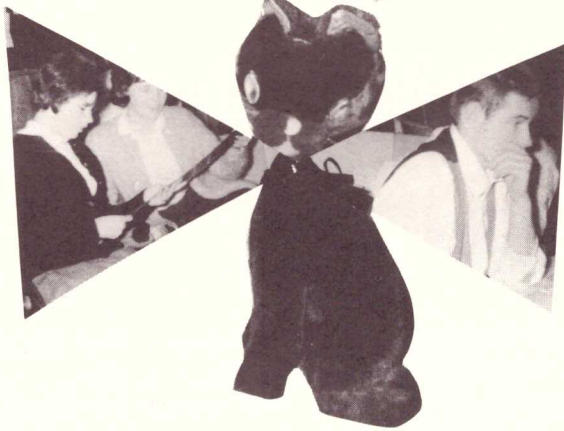
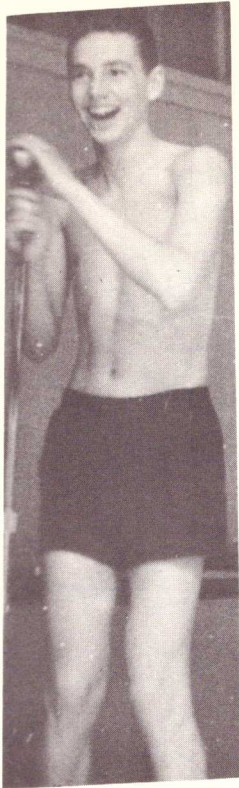
