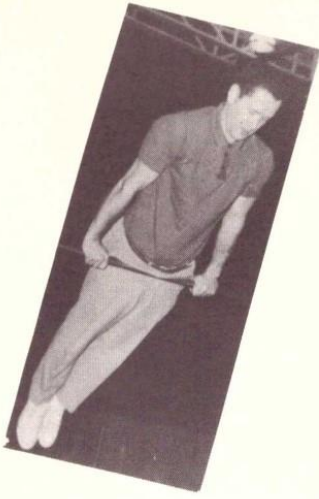
Yesterday, I contently strolled to it,

And the ambitious are always working in it.

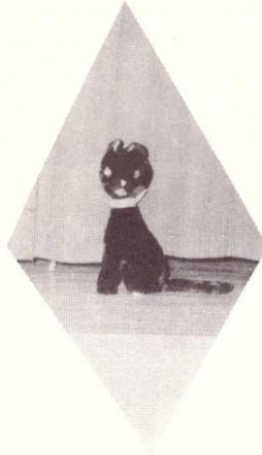

Time is strange.

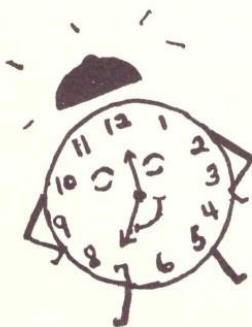
