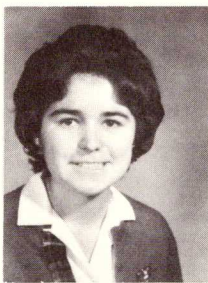

Activities—future teachers' club, C.Y.O., Scope.

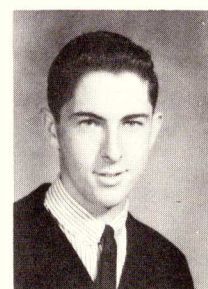


Burglind Blei—"with mirth and laughter let old wrinkles come." Combine musical talent, an infectious laugh, and you have Burglind, the last of the lively ones.

Activities—Glee Club, U.N. Club, class sports, drama.

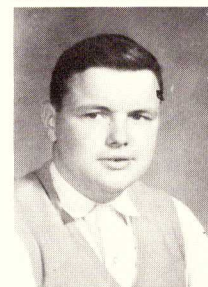

Activities—Red Cross, typist (yearbook), drama.



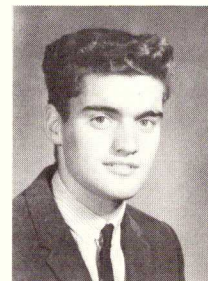

Activities—yearbook, C.Y.O., Scope.

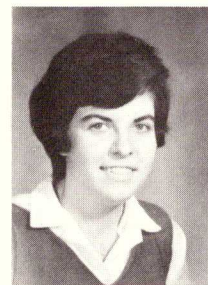

Activities—Students' Council (ex vice-president), canteen, hockey, drama, class sports.

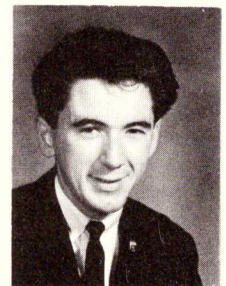

Activities—yearbook, class sports, swimming instructress.

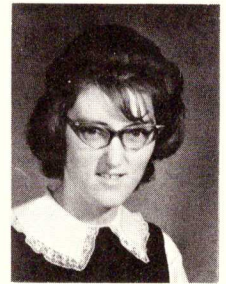

Activities—Students' Council (president), Red Cross, school d.j.



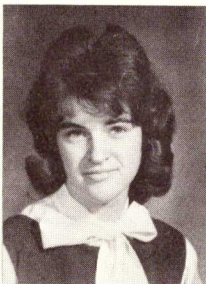

Activities—decorating committee, school canteen.



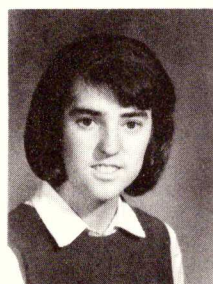
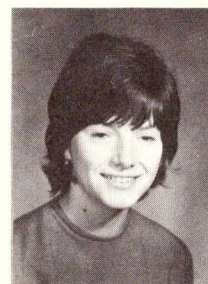

Activities—class sports, canteen, Scouts.

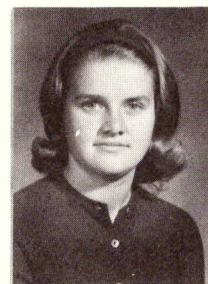

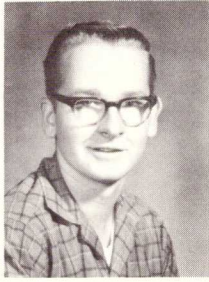
Activities—decorating committee, school canteen.

Activities—class efforts.

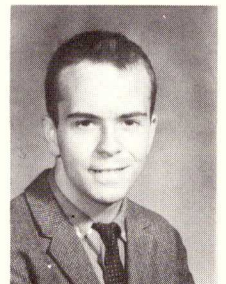

Activities—class efforts.



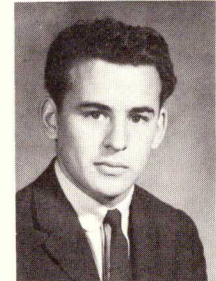
