SHARON HAMM -- "She is a quiet miss; we know not much about her."

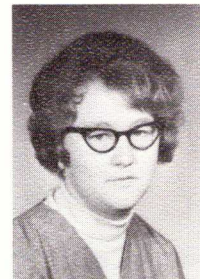

This busy member of 12A is a great asset to the advertising staff of the Yearbook. Nursing seems to be her main ambition. Activities -- Red Cross, Yearbook.

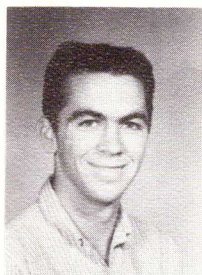
JEAN MacDONALD -- "Those who think her quiet have not seen the twinkle in her eye."

Activities -- Students' council.



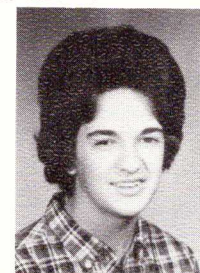
THOMAS MACKEY -- "I shouldn't . . . but I will."

JUDY SNEIDERMAN -- "I like to work, I really do, but I like a little mischief too."

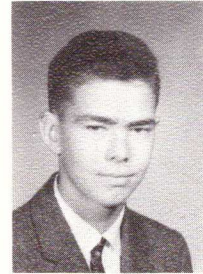

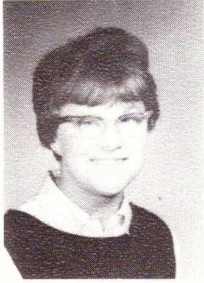


MICHAEL SMITH -- "Clomp! Clomp! Clomp!"

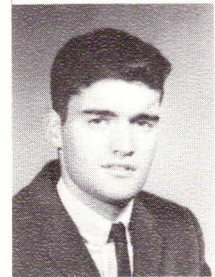
