Eric Henneberry and Carl Hartlen reign today as the heroes of B. C. Silver High School along with other members of the Spartans team that defeated St. Patrick's High School, 6-3, in Metro High School Hockey League action yesterday afternoon at the Forum.

No matter how many games the much improved Spryfield High School wins this year they will undoubtedly remember this one best. After dropping their first league start 4-1 to the newest entry in the loop on Friday night, they rebounded with an outstanding effort to defeat the defending champions yesterday.

The Spartans win was the first against a Patricians hockey team since they joined the Metro loop. Much of the credit for the win went to Henneberry and Hartlen but there were other heroes for the winners as well. Henneberry scored three goals while Hartlen was outstanding in nets turning aside 28 of 31 shots. Other outstanding performers included Georges Lameroux who scored a goal and was the most effective defenceman in the game and Jim Pelham who also counted a goal but made his biggest contribution with his leadership of the attack.

Dan Chambers counted the other B.C. Silver goal while John White, Gary Peddle and Jim Fraughton scored for the losers.

B. C. Silver players outthusted their opponents and once they gained the lead forechecked tenaciously, breaking up St. Pat's rushes time after time. The game was a rough affair with the referees handing out 24 penalties including four majors, a misconduct, a game misconduct and a match penalty.

HOCKEY

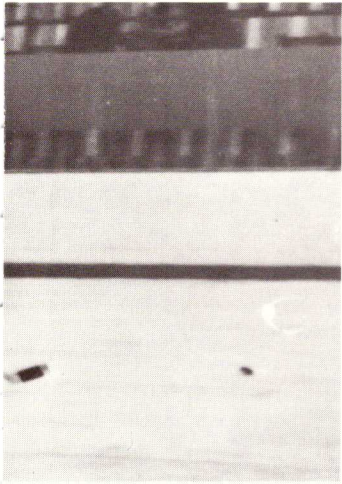

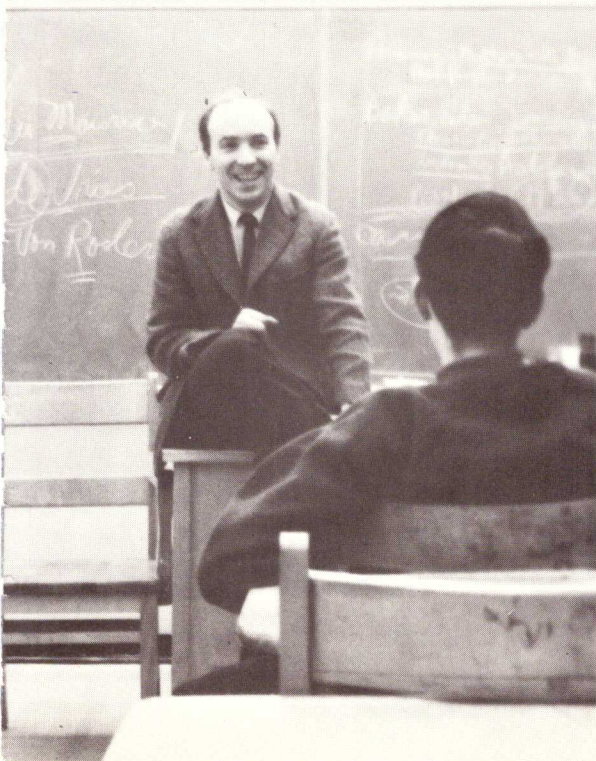

The top bowlers of our league also participated successfully for the Prince Andrew Trophy against student bowlers from the Metro area and the greater Maritimes.

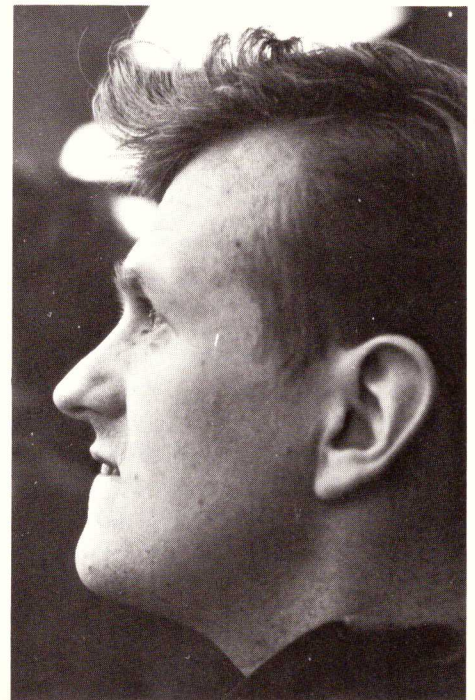

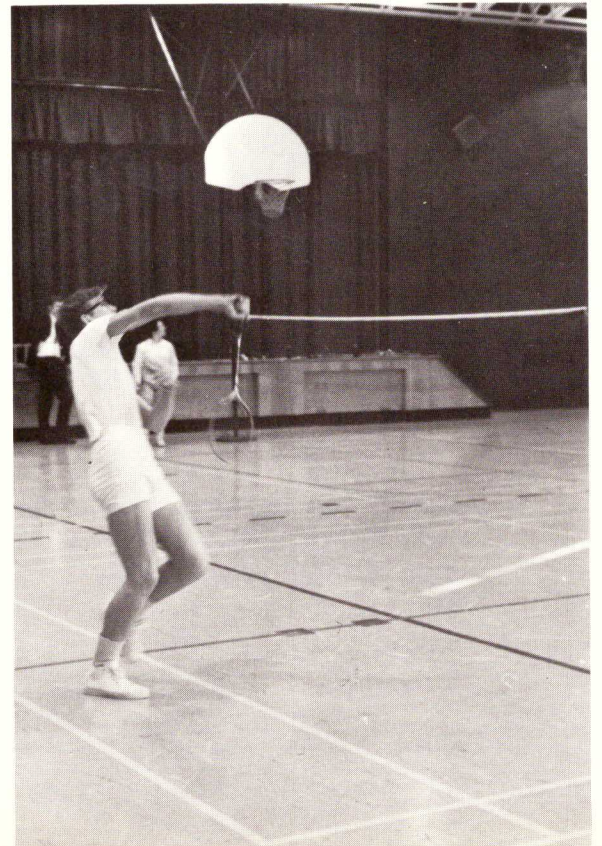
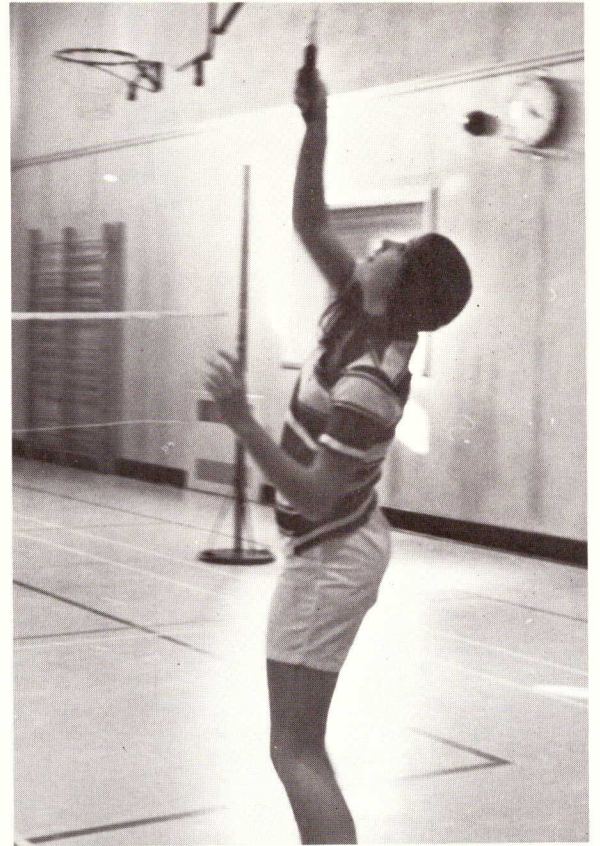
